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Fund Commentary

The Affluence Investment Fund increased by 1.4% in January, with the ASX 200 increasing by 3.9%. Global markets roared back in January, seemingly forgetting about the last quarters falls. Since commencing in December 2014, the Fund has returned 7.5% per annum through what has been a relatively difficult investment period. This has included 6.6% per annum monthly distributions to investors and an 0.9% per annum increase in the unit price of the Fund. Over that same period, the Fund has outperformed both our benchmark of 6.9% per annum (inflation plus 5%) and the ASX 200 (including dividends) of 6.9% per annum.

In January the Affluence Investment Fund performed reasonably. Our biggest positive contributors were the Dalton Street Capital Absolute Return Fund (up 10.2%), the Packer and Co Investigator Trust (up 6.8%), the Affluence LIC Fund (up 2.1%) and the QVG Opportunities Fund (up 5.1%). The biggest detractors were the India Avenue Equity Fund, the Bronte Capital Amalthea Fund, and our index put options that decreased in value as the market recovered. We continued to increase our allocation to a number of investments where we believe there is the best value. At the end of January, for the first time in guite a while, we made a substantial additional investment into the Affluence LIC Fund. Within the LIC sector we are seeing an attractive combination of good value

in the underlying share portfolios (those equities held by the LICs) plus better than average discounts to NTA. These greater than average discounts to NTA can take some time to normalise, however we are excited about the latent opportunity in the Affluence LIC Fund.

Another sector we have been finding opportunities in is the listed property sector. We made a new investment in January into Unibail-Rodamco-Westfield CDI's (ASX: URW). This is a global REIT, based in Europe, that owns some of the premier shopping centres in the world in key global cities (New York, London, Milan, Paris, etc). URW has been trading at a substantial discount to net asset value, and we made a small purchase at more than a 30% discount. The market appears to have discounted retail REITS globally because of the threat of Amazon and online shopping, regardless of quality. While we would certainly not find this opportunity overly attractive if we had to pay full net asset value, at a substantial discount we believe the risks are more than priced in. The location of many of these assets is completely irreplaceable, and we expect to get paid a circa 8% distribution yield on our purchase price. We currently have over 5% of the Affluence Investment Fund invested in discounted property stocks, ranging from a 14% to over 50% discount to net asset value. While we may have concerns about the headline valuations of direct

property assets, at such deep discounts we are very happy to get paid healthy distributions to be patient.

At month end, 66% of the portfolio was invested in unlisted funds, 15% in the Affluence LIC Fund, 9% in listed investments and 10% in cash. 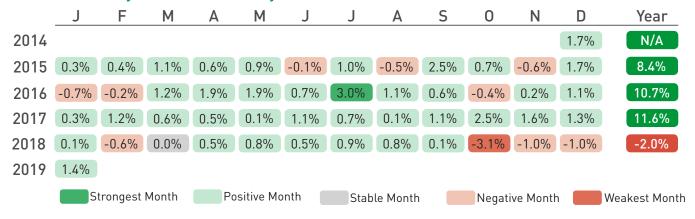
The cut-off for this month's applications is 25th February. Units will be issued effective 1st March.

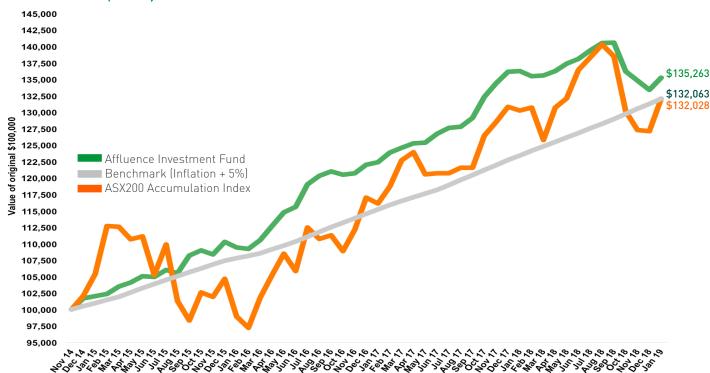

Fund Monthly Return History

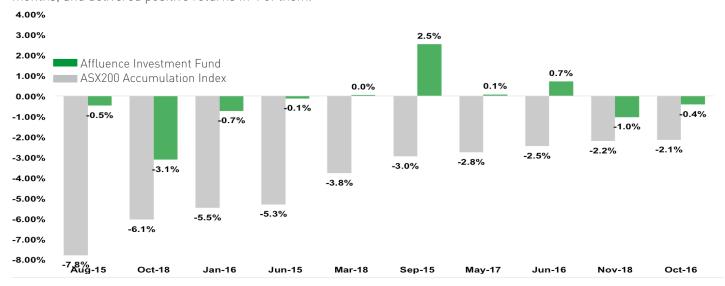


Return on \$100,000 Investment



Fund Performance vs ASX 200 - Worst Months

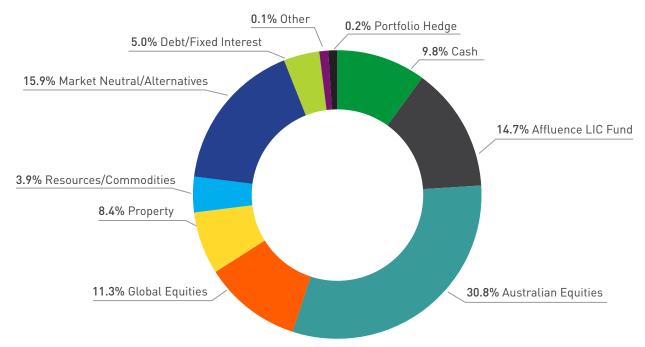
